

2023 School Grant Program

The objectives of the school grant program developed by the Ministry of Education and Training are to increase access to education and training for all, reduce the financial burden on parents in sending their children to school and improve the quality of teaching and learning.

Annual school grants

All government and non-government assisted schools receive the grants.

Early Childhood Education Grant (Ages 4 & 5)

Exam Fee (Years 12 to 13/14)

9,000VT / student

Primary School Grant (Years 1 to 6)

8,900VT / student



Secondary School Grant (Years 7 to 14)

8,125VT / student




Secondary School Tuition Fee Subsidy (Years 7 to 13/14)

42,000VT / student

Working together on SSP & school budget



The school grants are paid annually in three instalments:



in January

Tranche 2 30%

in April



What can school grants be used for?

School grants must only be used to cover expenditure that directly benefits students.

School community participation in School Strategic Plan (SSP) and school budget



The Principal must consult with the School Council to develop the SSP and the school budget.



The SSP and the school budget must be approved by the School Council, in consultation with the school community including parents, teachers and students.

What are the school reporting requirements?

MALAMPA: 33885

- Annual financial reports (including grants funded by donor partners), SSPs & overall school reports must be sent to the Provincial Education Office by 28 February each year. All reports and plans are:
 - to be approved by the School Council

Phone numbers:

- to be presented to the school community in the annual general meeting
- All schools are required to update all relevant information in Open VEMIS by 31 March each year.
- Monthly and annual financial reports approved by the School Council must be updated in Open VEMIS and sent to the Provincial Education Office. Reports must be displayed on the school notice board every month.
- The school grant certificate must be printed by the school and displayed on the school notice board, so the school community is informed of the grants that are paid to the school.


